MINUTES OF MEETING HELD 26TH SEPTEMBER 1983 IN THE COMMUNITY HALL, TRAWDEN

4. CORRESPONDENCE: Letter from Lancashire County Council explaining why it is not possible for the Barn to be used as a regular base and stating that it is not to be used for anything other than the general display at the Barn and that this matter is being discussed with the Barn's landlord.
1. APOLOGIES: Apologies received from Mrs. A. Armstrong.
2. MINUTES: Minutes of meeting held 22nd August 1983 approved and adopted.
3. MATTERS ARISING:
 - Aeromodellers - It was reported that an official of the Aeromodellers had been approached regarding the complaint of local children being threatened by Aeromodellers and he said steps would be taken to prevent a recurrence of the incident. Complainants are monitoring the situation and it will then be determined what action is necessary.
 - Crack in wall of Old Joseph's Barn - This has now been repaired.
 - Questionnaire from L.C.C. asking for information about the Neighbourhood Council as a voluntary organisation.
 - Training Course for Councillors - Mrs. Robinson, Mrs. Stonelake and Mr. Robertson hope to attend.
 - Bulb Planting Scheme - Leisure Services have promised to provide a sackful of daffodil bulbs when available.
 - Hand Gliding - No reply as yet from Leisure Services.
 - Hedge around Library - Confirmed that a hedge of Berberis has been planted but the shrubs are very small and doubt was expressed as to whether they will survive.
 - Nicholl House Farm - Mr. Haley reported that a deputation from the village had met Mr. John Lee, M.P., giving him the full facts regarding the erection of the piggery buildings and subsequent Public Inquiry. A petition was handed to Mr. Lee from householders affected by the nuisance. After discussion, it was resolved to write to the Health Department asking for a copy of the report from the Water Board after they had tested the drains in July.
 - Conversion of shippon and Pottery area to form an association at the Craft Centre - Mrs. Robinson expressed her delight at the appearance of the stone-flagged footpath in the field behind Trawden Hall and it was agreed that a letter of thanks should be sent to the Pendle Centre for Re-employment.

Resolved to contact Mr. Watson with this suggestion and give him the name of the person to contact at Community Service.

Programmes for Village Show - Mr. Bleasdale said there had been a misunderstanding about the supplier of the programmes as these were being printed by Mr. Stephen Woodward and not Outline Printers.

4. CORRESPONDENCE:

Letter from Lancashire County Council explaining why it is not possible for the Aisled Barn, Wycoller, to be kept open on a regular basis and saying that it is hoped to appoint one or two part-time assistants at weekends. Also, that it is proposed to improve the general display at the Barn and that this matter is currently being discussed with the Pendle Heritage Centre.

Complaint of excessive noise - Skipton Road - Letter, from Environmental Health Officer stating that the two complainants are monitoring the situation and it will then be determined what action is necessary.

Questionnaire from L.C.C., asking for information about the Neighbourhood Council as a voluntary organisation. Resolved to reply stating that we do not come under this category but are concerned with environmental care.

Planning Application 83/1160P - Conversion of shippon and pottery area to living accommodation at the Craft Centre, Wycoller.
