MINUTES OF MEETING HELD IN THE COMMUNITY HALL, TRAWDEN, ON 24th NOVEMBER, 1986

1. APOLOGIES Apologies received from Mrs M Waterworth and Mr G Foulkes.
2. MINUTES Minutes of meeting held 28th October 1986 approved and adopted.
3. MATTERS ARISING Reported that the gullies have been cleared on Winewall Lane but that attention is still required to the gullies on Mire Ridge, in particular on the left hand side going towards Colne.
Christmas gifts for the elderly - The list has now been completed and forwarded to the Town Hall, Nelson. Mr Robertson will collect the envelopes as usual and pass them on to Mr Haley.
Chelsea - It was suggested that a handrail should be erected alongside the footpath along Chelsea and it was resolved to approach the Pendle Centre for Re-employment to ask if this could be done during the improvement scheme.

CORRESPONDENCE

Letter from the Department of the Environment detailing the reasons for refusal of permission for the open cast mine at Shelfield. Footpath at bottom of Dean Street - Letter from Borough of Pendle confirming that this work will be carried out in the near future.
Footpaths at Boulsworth Drive and Street lighting in Winewall - Letter from the Borough Engineer stating that the footpaths do not appear to be in poor condition but that repairs will be carried out to the footpath sign at the rear of the Institute; also that the street light at Chapel Gates has now been erected and should be in service shortly.

Adoption of Dean Street - Letter from the Education Officer asking that we continue to press the Borough of Pendle and the County Council for proper surfacing of Dean Street and continuance of road maintenance thereafter.

Mayor's Appeal Fund - Letter from the Mayor thanking us for the donation of £10 to the Appeal Fund.

Village Show - Letter from Donald Leaver, Winewall, offering his services to the Village Show committee; also, letter from David Verity thanking us for inviting him to judge at the Show.

re Bus Terminus - The Chairman read out notes from the Council Minutes regarding the proposed alterations to the bus terminus.
