MINUTES OF MEETING HELD IN THE COMMUNITY HALL, TRAWDEN, ON THE 24th SEPTEMBER, 1984.

1. APOLOGIES:

Apologies received from Mr.D.Bleasdale and Mr. & Mrs.Armstrong  
Also from C.Councillor Sargeant who is in hospital and it was  
agreed to send him good wishes for a speedy recovery.

2. MINUTES:

Minutes of meeting held 20th August approved and adopted.

3. MATTERS ARISING:

Public Footpath No.20 running from Colne Road to rear of  
Primary School - The Chairman referred to the recent letter  
from the Borough Engineer suggesting that we write to Mr.Polla  
asking him to remedy his field drainage and said that he had  
discussed the matter personally with Mr.Pollard who felt that  
the problem should be tackled at source, i.e. Prospect Farm.  
Resolved to reply to the Borough Engineer on these lines and  
also mention that the constant blockage of drains on Colne  
Road is felt to be of the same problem. If a reply has not  
been received from the Borough Engineer within the next two  
weeks, it was resolved to write again asking for one before our  
next meeting.

Tram Tracks - Mr.Haley reported that more vehicles have been  
dumped on the tram tracks. Resolved to complain after next  
meeting if they are still there.

Trawden Scouts & Guides Supporters Group - Mr.Haley said  
it had been decided to have a bonfire but not the fireworks  
because of the increased cost. The Chairman proposed and  
Mr.Knowles seconded that £25 should be donated to the Group  
with a stipulation that it is used for village entertainment.

Community Bus Service - The Chairman had attended the last  
meeting and reported that so far very little progress has been  
made. He mentioned that from the fourteen Parish and  
Neighbourhood Councils who had been approached, nine had sent  
donations and the other five had either not replied or refused

Community Hall, Trawden - Letter from Leisure Services  
advising that our complaint regarding the raised paving stone  
has been passed to the Borough Engineer. Resolved to write  
to the Borough Engineer stating that two further instances of  
people falling have occurred and that the matter is one of  
urgency.

The Chairman referred to previous discussions regarding this site when it had been suggested that the Borough Council be asked to purchase it for development as a recreation area. It was pointed out that the land is now up for sale, letters have been sent to the Town Clerk and the Planning & Development Officer asking them to support our request. Mr. Spencer informed the meeting that the matter had been raised at a recent meeting of the Development Services Committee when it was resolved to ask the Estates Committee to make every effort to negotiate for the purchase of the land by the Council.

No reply as yet to our letter asking that our application for parish status be expedited.

The Chairman suggested that the Annual General Meeting should be postponed until October and asked the Press to publicise the need for new members.
