MINUTES OF MEETING HELD 21st MAY, 1984, IN THE COMMUNITY HALL, TRAWDEN

1. APOLOGIES: Apologies received from Mrs.Stone and Mrs.Stonelake.
2. MINUTES: Minutes of meeting held 30th April approved and adopted.
3. MATTERS ARISING:
 - Library - Reported that leaflets advertising the library service have been distributed throughout the village. No definite reports so far of any noticeable increase in the number of books borrowed since the new opening days came into operation this month.
 - Children's Playground - No reply to our letter as yet.
4. CORRESPONDENCE:
 - Alleged breach of planning condition re Nicholl House Farm - Letter from the Planning Department advising that they did receive a reply to their letter of complaint regarding the constant emptying of effluent. This was due to certain problems which it is now hoped have been overcome.
 - Bus Terminus - Letter from the Borough Engineer stating that the stone pillar will be rebuilt and that the shelter will have the missing windowpane replaced and then be repainted. He regrets it is not practicable to reconstruct the island.
 - Letter re the proposed Community Bus with attached leaflets giving more details of the service. A further meeting of the steering committee is to be held on the 31st May which Mr.Bleasdale will attend.
 - Planning Application 13/84/0595P - Black Carr Mill - Retention of temporary access and erection of new building at northern end of site - After discussion it was resolved to reply stating that -
 - 1) There is no objection to type of business (i.e. car valetting, steam cleaning and servicing) if the industrial effluent is disposed of in a proper manner,
 - 2) The present access is badly situated and would be better sited towards the northern end of the wall,
 - 3) It is hoped the yard will be improved,
 - 4) The wall at the southern end needs to be made safe and capped,
 - 5) It is hoped the yard will not become a long-term car park for storage of plant and old cars,
 - 6) Consideration should be given to stipulating certain hours of working to avoid the possibility of noise nuisance to nearby residents.

Other Planning Applications - Erection of wall with lean-to glasshouse at Beckside Cottage, Wycoller.

- Permission granted with condition for erection of bungalow and garage in the quarry, Keighley Road. Circular from Lancashire Association of Parish and Town Councils. Circular from Pendle District Sports Council. Circular from the Community Health Council.

5. REVISION OF MINUTES: None.

6. ANY OTHER BUSINESS: Mr. Armstrong reported that there are several cars dumped on the tram tracks which are a danger to children. Resolved to write to the Environmental Health Officer asking for their removal. Mrs. Robinson said she had been asked if Trawden could have a "Tidy up Trawden" campaign. It was agreed that it was a good idea in theory but would be difficult to put into practice in an area as widespread as Trawden. Suggested that the idea could be mentioned in the Colne Times to make people aware that a problem exists.

The meeting closed at 8-45 p.m.
